Now to business! The Grand Winsham Challenge is now closed, and the entries are being collated before passing them to the judging panel. I hope we will be able to publish the names of the winners in a week or so. Until then, you will just have to contain your excitement.

At the end of last month, Winsham Parish Council took the unprecedented step of publishing an open letter to the Management Committee of Winsham Shop and Post Office. In the letter it thanked the shop for its outstanding efforts over the last twelve months of Lockdown, and their support for the community not just in providing provisions, but for their general effort with extra services, and unfailing cheerfulness during a very difficult time.

Let's give the two organisations as much support as we can, for our own benefit, and as an acknowledgement of the sterling effort that has gone into making them happen, despite much uncertainty.
