21st January **Peterloo (12A) 154 mins**

This portrayal of the infamous 1819 Peterloo massacre is Mike Leigh's grandest and most ambitious film yet. With majestic battle scenes, sweeping shots of the British countryside and intimate scenes featuring a galaxy of characters, it builds to a shocking climax. After the victory of Waterloo the working and middle classes of the north were massing to have their say in who ran the country – and British forces attacked a peaceful rally in Manchester. Starring Maxine Peake and Rory Kinnear.

11th February **The Children Act (12A) 105 mins**

As her marriage to Jack (Stanley Tucci) flounders, eminent High Court judge Fiona Maye (Emma Thompson) has a life-changing decision to make at work - should she force a teenage boy, Adam (Fionn Whitehead), to have the blood transfusion that will save his life? Her unorthodox visit to his hospital bedside has a profound impact on them both, stirring strong new emotions in the boy and long-buried feelings in her.

11th March **The Wife (15) 100 mins**

Joe Castleman (Jonathan Pryce) is about to be awarded the Nobel Prize for his acclaimed and prolific body of work. His literary star has blazed since he and Joan (Glenn Close) first met in the late 1950s. *The Wife* interweaves the story of the couple's youthful passion and ambition with a portrait of a marriage, thirty-plus years later--a lifetime's shared compromises, secrets, betrayals, and mutual love.

8th April **Leave No Trace (PG) 109 mins**

Will (Ben Foster) and his teenage daughter, Tom (Thomasin Harcourt McKenzie), have lived off the grid for years in the forests of Portland, Oregon. When their idyllic life is shattered, both are put into social services. After clashing with their new surroundings, Will and Tom set off on a harrowing journey back to their wild homeland. Directed by Debra Granik (*Winter's Bone*).
