8th October Phantom Thread (15) 130 mins

In 1950s London, renowned dressmaker Reynolds Woodcock (Daniel Day-Lewis) and his sister Cyril (Lesley Manville) are at the centre of British fashion, dressing royalty and movie stars with the distinct style of The House of Woodcock. Women come and go through Woodcock's life, providing the confirmed bachelor with inspiration and companionship, until he comes across a young, strong-willed woman, Alma (Vicky Krieps), who soon becomes a fixture in his life as his muse and lover. His carefully tailored life is now disrupted by love.

Day-Lewis has announced that this will be his last acting role. It promises to be a bewitching film about secrets, obsession and elegance.

12th November The Bookshop (PG) 113 mins

It is 1959, and widowed Florence Green (Emily Mortimer) risks everything to open up a bookshop in the sleepy seaside town of Hardborough. When she exposes the narrow-minded townsfolk to the best literature of the day, including Nabokov's scandalizing "Lolita" and Ray Bradbury's "Fahrenheit 451", she gains a kindred spirit and ally in the figure of Mr Brundish (Bill Nighy), who is himself sick of the town's stale atmosphere, but has to reckon with the hostility of the other shopkeepers and of self-appointed doyenne Mrs Gamart (Patricia Clarkson).

Courage is the central theme of this delightful film about books, passion and dreams. It is based on the novel by Penelope Fitzgerald.
